

We saw some astonishing models of space rockets and satellites, we also saw space food and insides of space crafts. After admiring the models, we left for the University of Tsukuba. The University of Tsukuba was enormous and gorgeous. It had many departments related to different subjects, fountains, huge trees on sidewalks and vending machines. We were led by some university students for our workshops inside the university. We walked all our way to all the workshops.

Our first workshop was about Supercomputers. We were told about the uses of supercomputers, how it can be made more powerful and we also saw the supercomputers lab.
