SOCIAL WORK

Every year, in the memory of our beloved founder late Mrs. Sara Mathew, we organize a medical camp for the underprivileged community of Mohammadpur village. The slum area has no adequate health centre in the vicinity so conducting the camp helps people to address their neglected health issues. This year too, the CSA social work students of class 7th and 8th enthusiastically participated in the



event and got acquainted with the health problems afflicting the people of the community. The students of class 7th performed a street play on 'need for adequate medical attention' the previous day to spread awareness on health and hygiene. The students also distributed pamphlets and informed the community about the medical camp as part of awareness generation and mobilization. On 25th July 2019, the medical camp was successfully organized and around 90 people from the community received medical advice. The patients were also provided free medicines and the students got a chance to interact with them and observe their health needs.







Cleanliness drive by young St. Marians

As part of cleanliness initiative, the Social Work and Eco club students of class 7th were shown various documentaries on landfill and detrimental impact of excessive waste generation on our environment. After discussion and deliberation, the students decided to participate in the drive and generate awareness in the cleanliness community area of Krishna Nagar. They witnessed the deplorable condition of community park and lanes which have been filled with garbage by imprudent residents. It was an eye-opener for them to pick up trash and talk to the local residents about the garbage problem. The students expressed the desire to ponder upon a sustained solution to the impending environmental hazard. They got a chance to interact with the office members of the local councilor and discuss some immediate solutions to create a green impact.

PLANTABLE PENCILS

As a part of green school activity, Eco club students of class VII conducted an activity for classes V-VIII on recycling. Old and small in size pencils were recycled to make seed pencils. Students were also motivated to collect seeds of chilly, bhindi, brinjal, round gourd etc

Rolling the Dice



It is an year long activity, where group will present their topic as per the sequence in the book.





The students of classes 5 and 6 participated in inter-class English Poetry Recitation Competition. They were judged for overall presentation, voice articulation, memory, interpretation and understanding of the poem.

All the students participated in the first round which was conducted in their respective classes. They were given a list of poems to learn from and also allowed to choose a poem of their own choice.
